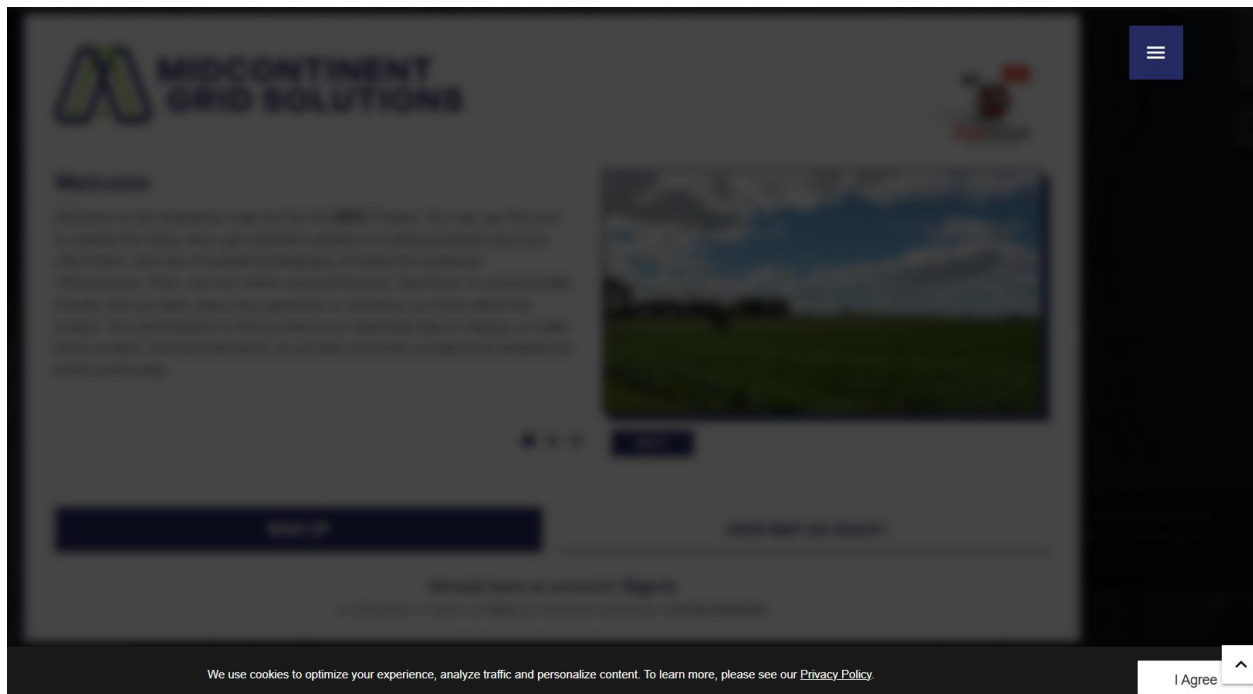


INFORMATION REGARDING WEBSITE MAP INTERACTION

A 765kV transmission line project known as BECI that is proposed to run through Jefferson County. The decision to upgrade this transmission line was made by the Midcontinent Independent System Operator (MISO), the Regional Transmission Organization that covers much of the upper Midwest and parts of the central United States. MISO selected Midcontinent Grid Solutions (MGS) to build the line. The final route will be determined by the Wisconsin Public Service Commission (PSC). It is expected that MGS will submit their plans to the PSC in early 2027.

MGS has updated their [website](#) to include detailed maps and project information, including simulated views of the transmission lines. **There is also an interactive map, but it's easy to miss. It is blurred out until you hit "Accept" and then you can either choose to view as guest or create an account. To comment on the map directly, you must create an account.** The map initially looks like this:



When viewing the map, you will see a number of lines. The final project will only be one line. These various routes are alternate projects that will be refined and submitted to PSC for PSC to select the final plan.

MGS is holding an open house in Jefferson County at the Fair Park Activity Center on Wednesday, August 26th from 10am-1pm. This initial comment period will allow them to refine their alternate routes in advance of another feedback period coming this November. MGS will then further refine their plans before submitting all routes to PSC in early 2027.

PSC will then review all information and offer an additional period of public comment before they select the route.
